#### DISCUSSION

Regarding 2019 revenues/expenditures to date and expected through the end of 2019.

- Projected 2019 balance to be carried over to 2020, \$198,894.35
  - o Most is Fire Building sale \$148,894.35, some FEMA \$56,608.52
  - Will apply some of FEMA and MHFD building sale to Public Works, new plow truck in 2020
- Cost during 2019 related to Dane Co. rezone/Chapter 10 project, labor intense for Plan Commission, Deputy to the PC, and Town Attorney.
- One project with bids approved for 2018 has been moved to 2020 -Cement pad at salt shed
- We currently have no debt and have budgeted for no loans beyond the fire dept. building
- Thanks to Fire Building Sale, Not borrowing for the snow plow will be selling old truck in 2020

## Proposed 2020 budget

- Public Works project forwarded from 2018 -cement pad for sale building
- Snow Plow truck paid in full during 2020, assuming we get expected price for truck we are selling
- Hire help to trim larger trees, \$5000/yr until no longer necessary
- Schools-2019 due 1/15/20; 2020 due 2/20/20
  - O Verona and Mt. Horeb property values are up; as a result, mill rate actually down
    - Verona \$1,208,927.55
    - Mt. Horeb \$2,244,268.52
  - o Madison Tech is down \$299,094.83
  - o Dane Co. Not Available Yet
- New Fire/EMS building; 10 year reserve loan, will affect budget of future years
- May be more labor cost related to Dane Co rezone/Chapter 10 project; Plan Commission & Attorney
- No increased to user fees (user fees are hoped to cover Town's cost related to those services)
- Trash/Recycling cost locked in for another three years; Spring Clean-up cost was nearly double prior years; new homes to collect from & pay for
- Town Board & Patrolman road analysis in late spring to allow for bids. Patrolman believes we are catching up with road maintenance; but, still need improvements We have right-of-way trees to clean-up. Budgeted help. Weather, the great unknown.
- TRIP Funds (Roads) approximate \$14,000, may come in 2019 yet.
